Forest Park, which at 1300 acres is about 60 percent larger than New York's Central Park, is home to the **Saint Louis Art Museum**, one of the top 10 comprehensive art museums in the country. The park's **Municipal Opera**, the nation's oldest and largest outdoor theater, offers more than 12,000 seats for classic operas and musicals. The park is also the site of the **Missouri History Museum**

and the **Saint Louis Science Center**, which is fourth in the nation for the number of people it serves. And the nearby **Missouri Botanical Garden**, a national historic landmark, is one of the most beautiful and scientifically significant botanical gardens in the world.

A **cradle of the blues**, St. Louis is the home of such musical figures as Miles Davis, Chuck Berry, Albert King, Ike and Tina Turner and John Hartford. An impressive lineup of national and local musical entertainment from all genres performs throughout the region on a nightly basis, and the internationally acclaimed **Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra** regularly serves up exciting music in the plush Powell Symphony Hall.
