Mobile Health Program – Healthy Kids Express

Healthy Kids Express is a mobile van program designed to bring health care to children in St. Louis city, surrounding counties and the Metro East at no cost to their families. This program offers a range of screenings including hearing, vision; physical exams, scoliosis checks, immunizations, anemia, lead, dental and asthma. Children from one to 18 years are eligible for care through this program. Healthy Kids Express provides services to 10,000 children per year and is made possible through the generosity of donors to the St. Louis Children's Hospital Foundation. The following are items that are needed from the children in the community whom we serve:

Calculators

Coloring books/crayons/markers

Giveaways such as small books, fast food toys, cars, puzzles, etc.

Personal Items, boys and girls (soap, bath/shower gels, lotions, deodorant, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, shaving cream)

School supplies (scissors, markers, pens, pencil boxes, backpacks, etc.)

Socks (all sizes)

Stuffed animals (new only), beanie babies

Tennis shoes (children's sizes – 1st through 8th grade)

Winter Accessories (gloves, mittens, hats, scarves)
