

VENTILATOR/TRACHEOSTOMY EDUCATION FOR NURSES AND CAREGIVERS: TEACHING AND TESTING WITH SIMULATION



WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Home health nurses who care for pediatric patients with tracheostomy tubes and home ventilators

PURPOSE/GOAL OF PROGRAM:

To provide home care nurses who care for home ventilator patients with enhanced ventilator education and emergency response skills to improve the patient's safety and limit re-admissions related to tracheostomy emergencies.

THIS IS A TWO-PART PROGRAM

Review of multiple home ventilators

- Verbalize why patient is on the ventilator
- Explain the ventilator parts and settings
- Recognize and respond to alarms

Simulation of tracheostomy emergencies

- Identify a simulated tracheostomy emergency
- Respond appropriately to a tracheostomy emergency
- Change tracheostomy tube

WHY IS THIS PROGRAM UNIQUE?

The Saigh Foundation Pediatric Simulation Center, developed with support from the Saigh Foundation for St. Louis Children's Hospital, is the only medical simulation center within 300 miles dedicated specifically to pediatric patients.

Simulated events through this program provide experiences in managing emergency situations that are common in children with tracheostomy tubes. The scenarios and feedback from instructors provide a safe yet lifelike learning environment for nurses to refine skills essential in clinical care.
